

Crocodile balance game



We're stoked by this adorable crocodile balance toy! This single or multiplayer game involves propping the 12 leaves on the crocodile's back without tipping any off. Dexterity, concentration and visuconstruction are a must!

A die is also provided to help your child understand basic game instructions. Little ones can roll the die to decide whether the next leaf will be small or large. First step: to find the leaf indicated on the die. Second step: coming up with a game strategy in order to perfectly balance the leaf in question without tipping any others over.

Musical bells



Ding-Dong, Ding-Dong. The 3 small bells on their pretty wooden log are ready to start ringing! Watch as your child discovers their musical talent and sense of rhythm with the help of the wooden stick. They'll be able to use the colours to create short sequences.

Thanks to the 3 different sounds, children's hearing acuity will be stimulated, in addition to their musical awakening.
