

Mummy and baby turtle will have a helping hand in your child's walking and gross motor skill development. Mummy turtle can be pulled forwards in 2 different ways: via the string or using the handle on top of the shell.

Baby turtle can easily be grasped and played with as a figurine. To further promote little ones' dexterity, they can also try to slot the baby turtle into the shell.
